

GULFPORT FLOCK CAPABILITIES - READABLE SUMMARY

Capabilities reflected in Gulfport's 2023 and 2025 Flock agreements

Source note: This summary is derived from Gulfport's original 2023 Flock agreement and the October 2025 expansion order. It does not claim that Gulfport used every available feature. The underlying agreements remain the controlling source records.

2025 expansion order - expressly listed FlockOS features

Feature	What the Gulfport order says it does
Community Network Access	The order describes the ability to request direct access to feeds from privately owned Flock LPR cameras in neighborhoods, schools, and businesses in the community.
State Network (License Plate Lookup Only)	Allows agencies to look up license plates on cameras opted into the Flock network within the state.
Nationwide Network (License Plate Lookup Only)	The order describes access to a nationwide sharing network for license-plate lookups.
Law Enforcement Network Access	Allows requests for direct access to evidence-detection devices from law-enforcement agencies outside the customer's jurisdiction.
Time & Location Based Search	Search full, partial, and temporary plates by time at particular device locations.
License Plate Lookup	Look up specific license-plate location history captured on Flock devices.
Vehicle Fingerprint Search	Search footage using vehicle attributes including type, make, color, plate state, missing/covered plates, bumper stickers, decals, roof racks, and other features.
Insights & Analytics	Administrator reporting for device performance, user and network audits, plate-read reports, hot-list alert reports, event logs, and outcome reports.
Real-Time NCIC Alerts	Automated alerts tied to established databases for missing and wanted persons, including NCIC and NCMEC.
Unlimited Custom Hot Lists	Ability to add a suspect's license plate to a custom list and receive an alert when it passes a Flock camera.

2023 agreement - earlier capability references

The original Gulfport agreement also references national/local sharing, an interactive ESRI map, and Vehicle Location Analysis. Those terms show that the original deployment involved functionality beyond a stand-alone camera simply recording one plate at one location.

What this does - and does not - establish

These agreements establish that Gulfport contracted for a platform describing location-history lookup, time-and-location searching, vehicle-feature searching, network access, administrative analytics, hot lists, and mapping/location-analysis functions. They do **not**, by themselves, establish how often Gulfport personnel used each feature, whether every feature was enabled at every point in time, or whether every listed network was actually accessed in a particular investigation.

For public review, the key question is therefore not merely what the vendor platform can do, but which capabilities Gulfport possessed, enabled, accessed, or used under its actual account and policies.
